The San Luis Obispo County Office of Education (SLOCOE) continues to provide regular updates regarding schools. SLOCOE, all school districts, charters, and schools are responding to the statewide COVID-19 Shelter-At-Home order while continuing to serve our students, their families, and the community.

- All schools within our county will continue to deliver distance education to all students until it is safe to resume in-person instruction and after consultation with health and government officials.
- All Local Education Agencies (LEAs) continue to sanitize school facilities as an essential government function and re-sanitize when any staff access school facilities.

- All districts, charters, private, and parochial schools are receiving regular briefings.
- All districts, charters, private, and parochial schools have access to the San Luis Obispo County Office of Education's [Education Technology Portal \(ETC\)](#) for online educational resources.
- SLOCOE is working with local vendors to provide Internet access for all students.
